2.7 Student Satisfaction Survey Key indicator-2.7.1

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Introduction

The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is conducted annually at our college to evaluate and analyze students' perceptions of teaching, learning, institutional performance, infrastructure, and welfare. This survey plays a crucial role in enhancing the quality of our processes. The questionnaire primarily follows the guidelines recommended by NAAC.

The first 20 questions are objective, focusing on areas such as teacher communication, mentor responsiveness, ICT-based education, industrial visits, internships, and related topics. The final question invites students to provide suggestions for improving the institution's teaching-learning process.

For this survey, students are selected randomly and remain anonymous throughout the process. The email addresses of all 321 currently enrolled students were collected, and a random subset of approximately 200 students was chosen to participate in the survey.

Questionnaire has been sent to the randomly selected student's mail ids in Google forms through the link https://forms.gle/SRNDieRRD1iewiLP6.

103 students out of 200 have respond to this survey and their response have been recorded.
